



# Avalon Treasures

## The King's Thrown

Most adventures list a bunch of gold and magic items that are found. Gee sort of boring after awhile, so Avalon Treasure would take that basic idea and stand it on its head. List what is found, but do it in a detailed way which in turn might create new adventures.

Don't just tell the players that they find 3,000 gold piece and a +1 magic long sword.

Why not...

You find three small chests, each is locked and made of rare wood. (An appraisal skill roll will reveals that the chests are each worth about 50 gps, but only if you can sell them in large town or city). Even more important though are the locks set into the wood of the chest. Each is an expertly crafted lock of brass and copper; they are superior rank locks which means a DC of 40 must be beaten in a disable device roll in order to pick the lock). If taken to any locksmith the locks could bring in 75-100 gps. each or if the locksmith is only allowed to examine the locks, they would pay a good 10 gps. for the privilege. Take it to enough locksmiths and a small bundle of gold could be had.

Besides the three chests, (Which by the way, contain small sacks of red silk that a hold a total of 1,000 gps. in small, cut gemstones per chest) there lies an oil painting of the king of the realm, a man sitting upon his throne, but one most commonly found in the privy. There he sits, counting coins of the realm which lie in great piles around him, the King doing his business while gloating over his great wealth. The painting was done by a famous artist, which the King had hanged. The painting was said to have been burned but the King would pay around 1,500 gps. to have it brought to him. Others though, would also love to have the painting, and would pay just as much to have it in their possession.
