

Avalon Treasures



Museum of the Ancients

The PCs have uncovered an ancient museum uncovering treasures that even the ancients considered err... ancient. This is a level 11 treasure encounter worth 7,000 gps. for a standard fantasy campaign.

The museum itself may be a chamber in some ruin or a stand alone building out in the wilderness. Maybe its part of a forgotten city that the PC's have found. Either way, once any guardian monsters and dangers have been cleared away, the PC's may explore this wondrous pace.

Treasure

Some of the items are still standing on their original pedestals with explanations etched in brass plates while other items are scattered throughout the museum. In addition, some items have been damaged by looters and natural disasters over the centuries. One item hidden away in a rubble-filled corner is a miniature mithral circlet engraved to look like a laurel. If the PCs search in its general location, it will take about 10 minutes per DC 15 perception skill roll. It weighs about two pounds and it is worth 1000 gps.

Another item of interest is a necklace hanging on its original pedestal. The brass plate where the description and significant of the item would be indicated is actually damaged and unreadable. The necklace chain is made of silver and there are a dozen miniature jade idols attached to the chain. All of them look like they are the same reptilian humanoid in various positions. It weight about five pounds and it is worth 1200 gps. Interesting that past looters have never disturbed this obvious bit of wealth.

There are several bone masks located throughout the museum. Each one of them is carved with etchings of different constellations. Each mask weighs between one to two pounds. and each one of them is worth 50 gps. There are a total of sixteen masks in the museum worth a total of 800 gps. (If the number of constellations are more than what is in the campaign, then feel free to describe other celestial bodies on the masks).

A small stone slab on top of one of the display columns is covering a treasure from the past. They are a pair of hairpins shaped like long thin dragons and they have tiny but flawless ruby eyes. They weigh less than a pound and they are worth 550 gps.
