

Aphrodite is m@ried to Heph@stus, @nd is known for h@ring numerous @f@rs with gods @nd mort@s. Among those @e Ares @nd the mort@ Adonis, who w@ killed by Ares. She is widely

known for using her wiles to g@n the upper h@nd in the politic@ @en@of the gods. Only Artemis, Athen@@nd Hesti@@e immune to Aphrodite's ch@ms.

One of his most f@nous children, Asclepius, bec@ne the gre@est physici@n of @l with the @ility to restore life. Some c@led him the god of he@ing, though his gift to restore life, proved to be his undoing @nd Zeus slew him with @thunderbolt. Angry th@his f@her h@l killed his own f@orite son, Apollo took venge@nce @l@nst @cyclops, m@ker of the thunderbolts. Zeus, in @it of r@e, would h@e thrown his own son to T@t@us h@l Leto not ple@led for their son's life.
